Cherishing the Waiting for God's Grand Surprise

I've never been all that good at waiting. I guess you could say I'm fairly impatient, though I have grown more patient as I've matured. And here we are in Advent, the season of waiting. Of course, it is a different kind of waiting. The waiting I grow impatient with has to do with wanting events to go as I plan them. The waiting we do in Advent has to do with waiting for events to go the way God plans them. It is a different kind of waiting — holy waiting.

I remember waiting to open Christmas presents as a child. I would tear into them the minute we were allowed. Some years, I would even sneak a peek if the package was oddly shaped and rattled strangely. And then there was

Christmas Eve and trying to go to sleep knowing that Santa Claus would be coming at some point in the night. All that waiting was exciting and excruciatingly painful, all at once! And then I remember what it was like once it was over, which always seemed to come too quickly. In a weird way I wanted to go back to the waiting. It was more exciting.

And so now, as an adult, I cherish the waiting. I have experienced years and years of what happens after the waiting. It is kind of like planning and packing for a trip. For some, that's the highlight of the trip. I wait for God to surprise me with God's grace and mercy. I wait for God to reveal once again the Christ Child in my life — that small

wonder that grows into a peace that surpasses all understanding. I wait with hopeful expectation for the fulfillment of God's promise that all shall be revealed. This kind of waiting sustains me in the ordinariness of everyday life. I pray it does you, too.

As we look ahead to 2010, we do so with much anticipation and excitement. It will be another awesome year in the life of St. Peter's Episcopal Cathedral. Of course we will have to wait for it. The best is yet to come.

May your Advent and Christmas be filled with expectation and hope.

Messiah on December 13: Hallelujah!

What would Christmas be without a performance of Handel's *Messiah*?

"It's a reinforcement of all the messages of Advent and Christmas. It's hard to imagine Christmas without it. *Messiah* is a tradition, a big part of the fabric of Christmas, a real gift," says Dwight Thomas, our organist/choirmaster. He will conduct a performance of the Christmas portion of *Messiah* at 4 p.m. Sunday, December 13, with choirs, soloists, and

chamber orchestra.

The Christmas portion includes many of the great pieces of music we all know: "For Unto Us a Child Is Born," "And the Glory of the Lord," and "Glory to God." As is traditional, the performance will include the "Hallelujah Chorus." George Frideric Handel composed *Messiah* in just 24 days in the summer of 1741, setting to music a libretto by Charles Jennens, and it had its premiere in Dublin the following spring.

Rehearsals for the hour-long performance started in early November. "The choir this year is by far the best *Messiah* choir" of any he has conducted, Dwight said. (He has led four previous perfor-



mances of *Messiah* at other churches.) It includes members of our own choirs and singers from four other churches. The 21-piece orchestra was assembled by a local music contractor from area professional musicians, who spend most of the month of December playing *The Nutcracker* and *Messiah* in performances all over the Tampa Bay area.

Among the singers are four of our older trebles — our children's/young people's choir — who sang *Messiah* last year under our previous choirmaster, Edward Barbieri, and volunteered to sing again this year. "I'm grateful to everyone who is taking the time to sing at this busy time of year," Dwight said.

The performance of *Messiah* is part of the Cathedral Arts program Dwight is developing. "My plan and hope is to do two choral masterworks with orchestra each year," he said. "*Messiah* is a logical choice for December. For spring I am planning to do



Durufle's *Requiem*."

"The Cathedral needs to be a trail-blazer" in music and the arts, Dwight said. "The church has historically been a supporter and fosterer of the arts. It's good for the Cathedral to grab hold of that mantle, using the resources we have, and continue the tradition."

As he prepares for the last few weeks of rehearsals, Dwight said, "I often ponder how privileged I am to be able to help present a classic masterwork with some really fine musicians, and work with the orchestra and with singers who love to sing *Messiah* and have chosen to sing. I'm blessed and privileged to have this opportunity."
